

It is May! Everything is in bloom, pollen is attacking my sister's sinuses, and the weather is getting increasingly warmer. Very appropriate that the Gospel for the last Sunday of April was the Gospel of the vine and the vine grower. There is a lot of gardening, tilling, and pruning happening right now if you are a gardener; I'm not haha. I enjoy plants and flowers and have grown potatoes and garlic that ended up being the size of my thumb nail, but I wouldn't consider myself a gardener as I am just as likely to accidentally kill something as I am to keep it alive. But whether or not you garden, you can see and observe how much work it is to keep a flower or vegetable garden. It takes care, and patience, and making sure the flowers or vegetables receive what they need.

As I said in the children's sermon last Sunday, plants and people are a lot alike. Give them what they need and they will thrive. Prune away the old and dead growth and they will grow and flourish. I've thought a lot since preparing last week's sermon about what it is I've had to prune from my life in order to make it healthier. I've had to prune relationships, letting go of friendships and even family when the relationship was no longer healthy. I've had to prune behaviors. There was a time when I couldn't healthily handle any sort of conflict, and while it's still not my favorite thing it is no longer devastating to my peace. I have to continually prune back imposter syndrome, jealousy, and judgment. And there are times I allow those feelings and behaviors to thrive longer than they should.

But that's really the key to pruning, isn't it? It's not something you do once and never have to do again. It's a practice that you have to keep up with whether agriculturally or metaphorically. What are the things in your life that need pruning? What motivates you to keep pruning?

Council Minutes: April 9, 2024

Absent: Zoey Karnes, Scott Trent - Vice Chair, Mike White

Pastor Kayla opened the meeting at 7:00 in the church Fellowship Hall. Susie Jennings provided the devotional. Ed Hagy to provide devotions for the next meeting.

The March council minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Ed Hagy to approve the minutes; motion was seconded by Susie Jennings and the motion was carried.

Billy Buchanan provided an overview of the financial report. Susie Jennings made a motion to approve the assistant treasurer's report; the motion was seconded by Danny Slemp and the motion carried. Billy requested approval of the council to transfer \$2385 from special accounts to pay the bill for the new toe mold in the Fellowship Hall. Joanne Groseclose made a motion to approve this request; Susie Jennings seconded and the motion carried. Laurie Thompson made a motion to approve the treasurer's report; seconded by Ed Hagy and the motion carried.

Billy Buchanan shared that the bank is wanting to close out the trust account that is used for the upkeep of Old Ebenezer. An individual needs to be assigned as trustee and a new account would need to be opened for the upkeep of Old Ebenezer. Action pending.

Old Business

Pastor Kayla referenced council's motion from last meeting to reduce the church's benevolence donation to Synod from \$10,000 to \$5,000. John Wertz, Assistant to the Bishop, addressed this during his visit last Sunday. He noted that the donation amount is each church's decision and that a formula to determine donation amounts is no longer used by Synod. Ebenezer plans to re-evaluate our benevolence giving at the end of the year.

Discussion took place regarding the possible use of extra space downstairs in the church, noting some of Pastor Wertz's comments as to how other churches are addressing the same issue.

Pastor Kayla shared that a visitor to the church last Sunday reports to having experience in mason work and agreed to make repairs in this area at Ebenezer if the church purchases the supplies and equipment needed. Following discussion where it was noted that the individual may only be in town for a brief period, it was decided that action on this issue would be delayed until further information could be obtained.

New Business

Pastor Kayla initiated discussion regarding when the announcements should take place during the worship service. Thoughts and options were presented. Decision made to return announcements to beginning of service. Pastor Kayla will announce the decision this Sunday with change taking place the following Sunday.

Billy Buchanan asked about the status of a possible new sound system. Pastor Kayla noted that JR Young has not responded to contact attempts and that she will reach out again.

Pastor Kayla asked for volunteers to do "temple talks" during upcoming worship services. Paul Hagy volunteered to provide a message on April 21 and Danny Slemp volunteered for May 19.

Susie Jennings made a motion to adjourn the meeting; Billy Buchanan seconded and the motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:05, ending with the Lord's Prayer.
